


Animals

1913

Estrada eventually sold the ranch to Jason Henry, who sold it to E.G. Lewis in 1913. Atascadero Mutual Water Company was incorporated August 13, 1913. Today AMWC is responsible for meeting the water requirements of more than 30,000 people.





1769-1833

Missions are built and established.



1845

Pedro Estrada is granted ownership of 39,225 acre Mexican land grant known as Rancho La Asuncion y Atascadero.





Atascadero Land Preservation Society
