Last year, we submitted a grant application with the State Natural Resource Dept. which would fund construction of a 2¹/₂ mile trail, development of three trailheads with parking and kiosks as well as funding for an interpretive signage program. We remain optimistic that our application will be awarded and will know our status very soon. Thirdly, Beginning October 1, a changing of the guard will occur in the ALPS Board. Vice President Mike Orvis and I will switch positions which will enable Mike to use his exceptional organ-



izational and analytical skills to benefit ALPS. In turn, I will have more time to focus specifically on the trail and other developments at TBOP and hopefully expedite the process towards public access. So you see, there is a lot going on at ALPS! 
AMWC SUMMER WALKS By Bruce Bonifas
