DEPARTING BOARD MEMBER

Don Jernigan who joined our Board of Directors in 1996 has retired. From 1996 until 2005 he served as our treasurer. During that time the responsibilities of the office increased enormously as we acquired several pieces of property including Stadium Lane adjacent to Stadium Park. In addition to his work as treasurer, Don and his wife, Helen, were major financial contributors to the acquisition of the Kennedy property now known as Stadium Lane. We will really miss Don on the board and thank him for a job well done. He will be formally recognized when we have our fence dedication.



FENCING PROJECT

The project to install fencing near the entrance to Stadium Park is moving forward. In conjunction with the City of Atascadero and Cal Trans, we are building a welded pipe and cable fence that will protect the area that is currently being abused by off-road vehicles. This abuse has resulted in erosion and dam-

to the natural resources in the area. The new gate and fence will be located 400' down towards Capis-



trano and will effectively protect approximately 3 acres of land from further degradation. Construction is scheduled to begin in February.

The fencing project is being funded by a \$7,000 award from a mitigation fine directed by the Regional Water Quality Control Board. Once the land is protected, we will begin resource restoration efforts including erosion control, removal of exotic plant species and planting of native plants. We hope to get some plants into the ground by mid-March to take advantage of the late winter rains.

Last summer, we submitted a large project proposal to cover all the costs of restoring this entire site. Although we were only initially funded for the cost of the fence construction, we were very excited to receive the award and to have the site acknowledged as a valuable resource worth protecting. We will continue to pursue all available funding sources to help us complete this important project. Upon completion of the fencing project, we will have a public dedication.
